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## Memoir recounting arctic adventure receives multiple awards including recognition for environmental writing

REFRACTION: AN ARCTIC MEMOIR recounts the power of Big Oil, dangers of working in an industrial environment, and growing threats posed by climate change

We each navigate our own youthful rite of passage—a precarious period when we are unsure which life path to take. *Refraction* is one person's journey told in a series of reflections on a time spent living in a frozen wasteland. Justifying the endeavor as a modern-day gold rush or a romantic odyssey could otherwise be viewed as another distorted image hovering above the horizon—another refraction.
